

MN KIDS CAMP JOB DESCRIPTION – A-TEAM (Formerly Grandparents)

OBJECTIVE

Be a source of comfort for the campers, helping the counselors and nurses.

REPORT TO

Assistant Coordinators and Coordinator

RESPONSIBILITIES

Pre-camp

- 1. Pray for all campers, volunteers and Evangelists.**
- 2. Read and understand the Camp Volunteer Manual.**

Camp

- 1. Meet at 3:30 pm on Day 1 in the Kingsriter Retreat Center lobby with the Assistant Coordinator for Orientation.**
- 2. Maintain a presence on the Campground.**
 - Assist with comforting the children, be a calming spirit.**
 - Interact with campers throughout the day by mingling with them at the commons area. (Geneva Java, Beach, Events, etc...)**
- 3. Assist Nurse as needed.**
 - Comfort sick campers**
 - Transport campers to and from the clinic – Remember the Rule of 3!**
 - There will be a schedule for who is on duty every night to transport kids to and from the clinic. The Assistant Coordinator will work out this schedule with all A-Team members for day and night shifts.**
- 4. Lights Out**
 - Be available from after the Evening service until an hour after Lights Out to help with homesick kids.**
 - Remember the Rule of 3!**
 - Only Females in girl cabins and Males in boy cabins**
 - There will be a schedule for who is on duty to help with lights out issues every night. This will be planned out at orientation.**
- 5. Meal Server.**
 - Arrive at the time listed on the schedule for the meals you are assigned.**
 - You will need to eat before serving.**
- 6. Attend the Camper Orientation, Morning Service, Halftime and the Evening Service.**
 - Crowd Control**
 - Pray with campers**

If you have any Physical limitations that will hinder your ability to perform any of the above named duties, please call the Kids' Ministries department at the Minnesota District office and inform them of these limitations. These limitations may or may not disqualify you from serving at camp.
